Choosing a Career

Career means occupation, which we want to adopt for earning livelihood.

Concept of career:

- ✓ Career means the progress and actions taken by a person throughout lifetime especially those related to that person's occupations.
- ✓ Career covers a sequence of positions in a job or an occupation that person is engaged in during his work-life.

Importance of choosing a career:

- Career planning serves as key to success.
- Its helps us in finding stability in our future lives.
- Career planning makes a person think suitably about his positive and negative aspects.

Career Avenues in business:

There are mainly two options

- a) Wage employment: Serving another person for wages or salary.
- b) Self employment: Occupation in which a person engages himself/herself in some economic activities on his own to earn livelihood.

Wage employment:

- Wage employment means serving another person for wages or salary.
- Wage employment exists in Railways, Government office, banks, factories, insurance companies etc;
- It do exists in schools, colleges, and hospitals.

Self employment:

- Self employment means doing something on your own.
- Running a book shop, medical shop, tailoring shop, repair shop and electrical goods.
- These people earn their living from business of buying, selling, or rendering a service.

Possible areas of self employment:

- Small scale retail business: Single owner, it can be grocery store, stationery shop or cloth store
- Providing services based on individual skills: Repairing bicycle, scooter, watches, tailoring, hair dressing etc which can be undertaken as individualized services to customers.
- Occupation based on professional qualification: Practicing doctors, lawyers, CA's, Architects etc
- Farming on small scale: Activities like dairy, poultry, fishery, horticulture, sericulture etc.
- ❖ Village and cottage industries: Activities like hand spinning and weaving, hand knitting, stitching garments. All of these can be based on traditional inherited skills.
- Arts and crafts: Gold smiths, black smiths, carpentry who have been trained in certain craftsmanship or art.

Preference for self employment over wage employment:

- Self employment gives opportunities for using one's own talent for one's benefit.
- In self employment, one's ability and time can be used in more profitable way.
- Self employment is possible even without large resources of capital and other facilities.
- Learning opportunities are more in self employment as he take all the decisions regarding his business activities.

Qualities required for success in self employment:

- ✓ Mental abilities.- Able to identify more suitable area, to take decisions, ability to deal with different type of customers, ability to anticipate problems and bear risks.
- ✓ Alertness and foresight: Should be aware of changes taking place in market and to have foresight to anticipate changes.
- ✓ Self confidence: Must have confidence in himself to overcome problems and also with suppliers/creditors, customers and government officials.

- ✓ Knowledge about business: Should have full knowledge about business which includes technical and skills knowledge also.
- ✓ Acquaintance with relevant laws: Must have working knowledge of laws relating to business and service activities.
- ✓ Other personal qualities: Honesty, sincerity and to be hard working.
