DEFINITIONS

Business

Business refers to an occupation in which goods and services are produced and sold in return of money.

Industry

Is the business activity, which is related to the raising, producing, processing or manufacturing of products.







Classification of business activity





Industry

The production side of business activity is referred as industry.

- which is related to the raising, producing, processing or manufacturing of products.
- The products manufactured are consumer's goods as well as producer's goods.

➤ What is meant by Consumer goods

Are goods which are used finally by consumers. E.g. Food grains, textiles, cosmetics, etc..

What is meant Producer's goods

Are the goods used by manufacturers for producing some other goods. E.g. Machinery, tools, equipment, etc..



Classification of industries based on products produced

Based on product produced, industries are classified into

- **Extracting industry**: Extracting material like coal, iron, petroleum etc...
- Manufacturing industry: Processing and converting raw materials into finished products like iron, petroleum, cement etc.
- > Construction industries: Construction activities like building, dams, bridges, roads etc...



CLASSIFICATION/TYPE OF INDUSTRIES:

2) GENETIC INDUSTRY:

- Refers to industry which engages in re-production and multiplication of plants and animals for sale.
- ☐ The main aim is to earn profit from sales.

For example: cattle rearing, poultry, cattle breeding etc..



2) GENETIC INDUSTRY:

For example: Plant industries, cattle rearing, poultry, cattle breeding etc..

3) EXTRACTIVE INDUSTRY:

- a) Refers to industry which extracts or draws out goods from soil, air or water.
- b) Product from extraction forms the raw material of manufacturing and construction industries.
- c) For example: mining industry, coal industry, oil industry, timber and rubber from forest etc..



3) **EXECUTIVE INDUSTRY**:

For example: mining industry, coal industry, oil industry, timber and rubber from forest etc..


4) MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY:

- Refers to industry which converts raw material into finished products with the
 - help of machine and man-power.
- \square The finished goods can be either consumer goods or producer goods.
- For example: textiles, chemicals, sugar industry, paper industry, etc.

CLASSIFICATION/TYPE OF INDUSTRIES:

5) CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY:

- a) Refers to industry that takes up the work of construction of houses, building, bridges, roads, canals etc..
- b) Goods produced and sold by construction industry are constructed at one place.

6) SERVICE INDUSTRY:

a) Refers to industry that provides services to people based on their requirement.

For examples: hotel industry, tourism industry, entertainment industry,

COMMERCE AND TRADE

Define – Commerce

Commerce is **the business activity**, which is related to distribution of goods produced by industry.

Commerce is classified into 1) Trade and 2) E-Commerce

Define – Trade

Trade is **the business activity**, which is related to buying of goods and selling to consumer. A **trader** is a middleman between the producer and the consumer.

Define – E-Commerce

E-commerce is the **business activity** which is related to buying and selling of goods though internet.



Aids or Auxiliaries to trade

Trade:

- 1. The term 'trade' is used to denote buying and selling.
- 2. Person who buys and sells is a **trader**. Thus, **a trader** is a middleman <u>between the producer and the consumer</u>.
- 3. Trade is of two type: 1) wholesale trade 2) retail trade



Aids or Auxiliaries to trade

- 6. All activities that facilitate smooth flow of goods from manufacturing centers to the consumption centers are called <u>aids or auxiliaries to trade</u>.
- 7. Aids to trade may be classified into five categories: (1) transportation, (2) warehousing, (3) insurance, (4) advertising, and (5) banking.





Aids of Trading:



1) <u>Transportation:</u> Goods or services are transported from one place to another for selling by suitable mode of transport.



2) <u>Warehousing:</u> Warehouse or godowns are used to store material produced in industry till they are sold.



3) Insurance:



Aids of Trading:

- Goods produced by industry are in the risk of damage or loss during storage or transport.
- It is very important for business to take insurance policy for the material from insurance companies paying certain fixed amount called premium.
- The insurance company compensates for any loss or damage of goods which helps the business man largely.

4)Banking:

- Supply money in form of loans.
- Help in financial transactions.





Aids of Trading:



4) Advertising:

- Advertising is an effective aid in selling the goods.
- The producer, through advertisement, communicates all information about his goods, to the consumers.
- This advertisements create in the consumer a strong desire to buy the product. Thus sales of the product increases.
- Communicating with people through advertising, when they are in their homes, is called <u>indoor advertising</u>. Examples are newspapers, radio, 'television, etc..
- Communicating with people, when they go out from their homes, is called outdoor advertising. Examples are cinema theatre, wall posters, and hoardings at prominent places.



Define – E-Commerce

E-commerce is the **business activity** which is related to buying and selling of goods and services though internet.





Points to remember:

- E-Commerce (e-commerce) or electronic commerce is the purchasing, selling, and exchanging of goods and services over computer networks (such as the Internet) through which transactions or terms of sale are performed electronically.
- E-Commerce is also called as **E-Business**. For online retail selling, the term **E-tailing** is sometimes used.
- Famous E-commerce website of online shopping are Amazon, Flipkart, ebay, Myntra etc..
- Financial transactions in E-commerce are conducted through electronic means like network banking, Paytm, google pay etc..





E-Commerce can be broken into four main categories: B2B, B2C, C2B, and C2C.

Types of e-commerce





TYPES OF E-COMMERCE

1) B2B (Business-to-Business):

- ✓ Companies doing business with each other such as manufacturers selling to distributors and wholesalers selling to retailers.
- ✓ Pricing is based on quantity of order and is often negotiable.

2) B2C (Business-to-Consumer):

- Businesses selling to the general public typically through catalogs utilizing shopping cart software.
- ✓ B2B takes the price, and the consumer to do the transaction .



3) C2B (Consumer-to-Business):

- ✓ A <u>consumer posts his project with a set budget online</u> and within hours companies review the consumer's requirements and bid on the project.
- ✓ The consumer reviews the bids and selects the company that will complete the project.
- ✓ C2B empowers consumers around the world by providing the meeting ground and platform for such transactions.

4) C2C (Consumer-to-Consumer):

- ✓ There are many sites offering free classifieds, auctions, and forums where individuals can buy and sell things online with ease.
- ✓ eBay's auction service is a great example of where person-to-person transactions take place everyday since 1995.



Other Forms of E-Commerce

1) Other Forms of e-Commerce that involve transactions with the government— from procurement, filing taxes, business registrations to renewing licenses.

2) Some of these are:

G2G (Government-to-Government), G2E (Government-to-Employee), G2B (Government-to-Business), B2G (Business-to-Government), G2C (Government-to-Citizen), C2G (Citizen-to-Government).

Advantage of E- Commerce:

- 1) Wider choice: Customer has wider choice of products and services and businessmen have wider market globally.
- 2) Improved customer service: Wider range of services during and after the purchase of material is provided to customers.
- 3) Quick response to customer needs: Transaction time is very less as producers bypass the distribution channel and supply to the customer directly.
- 4) Cost saving and price reduction: There is saving of cost in displaying in showroom and saving in godown for the producer so the customer get goods at lower price.
- 5) Market information: Businessmen are able to identify the customer needs based on the information online and are able to develop their business.
