



Capital	Capital is a term for financial assets, such as funds. Capital can also be associated with capital assets of a company	



Sole Proprietorship

(Single Ownership)

- Sole means Single and Proprietorship means Ownership.
- Only one person or an individual is the owner of the business.
- The business organisation in which a single person owns, manages and controls all the activities of the business is known as sole proprietorship form of business organisation.
- The individual who owns and runs the sole proprietorship business is called a 'Sole Proprietor' or 'Sole Trader'.
- Sole objective is earning profit.



Limited Liability Partnership – Salient Features

Legal Entity

Separate from its partners

Two or More Persons

- Lawful Business
- To earn profit
- As per LLP Act 2008
- At least one partner shall be resident in India

Liability

- Full extent of its assets
- Liability of the partners limited to their agreed contribution in the LLP

No Liability

 No partner is liable on unauthorized actions of other partners

Joint Hindu Family Business or Hindu Undivided Family Business (HUF)

- Business is owned by the members of a joint Hindu family.
- ☐ This form of organisation exists under Hindu law and is governed by the law

- For purposes of running of joint Hindu family business, only male members are entitled who are referred to as **coparceners**.
- ☐ The eldest member is known as the **Karta**. The management vests in the



of succession.

Joint Hindu Family Business or Hindu Undivided Family Business (HUF)

- In this form of business organization, the family possesses some inherited property.
- oxdot The inheritance of the property is among the male members.
- ☐ The share of ancestral property is inherited by a member from his father, grandfather and great grandfather.
- ☐ Thus, three successive generations can simultaneously inherit the ancestral

property.


