Storing of goods on <u>large scale</u> in a <u>systematic</u> and <u>orderly manner</u> from the time they are <u>produced</u> until they are <u>consumed</u>.

Characteristics of Warehouse



Located near highways, railway stations, airports, seaports to make loading & unloading easy



Mechanical appliances to reduce wastage and cost

Enough space to keep goods in order Cold storage for food items



Protection from sun, rain, wind, dust, pest



Parking space for loading & unloading 24 / 7 security to avoid theft fire fighting equipments

Seasonal Demand	produced throughout year ,bought seasonally->storage required
Seasonal production	Agricultural grains are harvested seasonal, consumed

Agricultural grains are harvested seasonal, consumed throughout year ->hence storage required

Huge numbers produced, stored till sales

Agricultural goods produced in one location, consumed throughout country->stored near consumption area

continuous production needs continuous supply of raw material ->hence storage of raw material required (sugarcane for sugar)

Excess Supply =fall in price Scarcity in Supply=rise in price warehouse stock helps stabilize nrice

Functions of Warehouses

1.Storage	large quantity of goods stored from production till consumption
2.Grading & Packaging	Sometimes warehouses do grading, packaging of goods to help owners in handling goods
3.Protection	Protects against dust, wind, rain, sun. Reduces wastage and spoilage
4.Transportation	Sometimes helps owner with transportation facilities to collect and to deliver
5.Risk taking	Responsible for theft, loss or damage to goods.
6.Processing (Ex-paddy, timber)	Sometimes warehouses process goods on behalf of owner Ex-paddy polishing, timber seasoning, fruits ripening
7.Financing	Depositor gets receipt from warehouse –to get bank loans Sometimes warehouses gives advances

1.Easy Handling	Warehouses mechanical appliances to reduce wastage and cost

4.Finance	Depositor gets receipt from warehouse —to get bank loans Sometimes warehouses gives advances
