- Kalamkari is done on cloth.
- It is done both in batik painting and printing technique.
- Blocks are used to print the design on cloth.
- Both for dyeing and printing, vegetable colors are used.

- Few birds, including two peacocks are part of this motif.

 Answer: Folk artists are simple people, and they make use of locally available material to make brushes, colours etc:
 - To draw fine lines, twigs or bamboo sticks are used.
 - To draw broad lines, a cloth wrapped on a twig is used.
 - Colours are made using vegetable materials and minerals.
 - Orange colour is made from dried and boiled Harsingar flowers.
 - Red colour is made from beetroot (Chokander)
 - ➤ Green colour from orhud flower. These flowers are dried, mixed with lemon, alum and gum and boiled.
 - ➤ Black colour from rusted fermented and boiled iron and molasses.
 - Cobalt blue colour from Indian black berry fruit (Jamun)
 - ➤ Golden colour from a mixture of alum and pomegranate.
 - > Yellow colour from Haldi.

SI No.	Characteristics	Example		
1	Folk art is inspired by fundamental life experiences.	Warli paintings depict activities of daily life like hunting, harvesting, dancing and sowing.		
2	They use locally available materials and prepare their own brushes.	Kalamkari pen is made out of bamboo reed, sharpened at one end. A cloth is rolled on the stick to use as brush.		
3	Colours are made using vegetable materials and minerals.	Madhubani painters used Henna leaves, marigold, bougainvillea, cow dung, soot and rice powder or lime.		
4	It depicts the social and religious life of various parts of India	Rajasthani Phad paintings usually narrate the stories of folk dieties of Rajasthan.
